Sharings

The smiles come back

Holding heart surgery cost notices (50 million vnd) of their child on the hand, Mrs. Ty and her husband – Phuong only can cry. Just 3 months old, the life of Tram – their youngest child is threatened by complicated heart disease. The poor parents just hoped that a miracle would save the life of their little girl.



Seeing us in a rainy day, Mrs. Ty was speechless with sob while her little daughter – Tram also was crying on her arms because of the constant pain. Mr. Phuong said that “to be parents, we are so miserable because we really feel useless, our daughter’s life is threatened every second but we cannot find

enough money to her “.

Phuong and Ty have got married for over 17 years. Those days, both of their families were poor but they still felt very happy with their new family. The young couple always firmly believed that if you worked hard and saved, someday, their lives would turn over into another page. Living with Phuong’s parents for a time, their children was born one after ones. When the small family has 5 members, Phuong decided to ask his parents for a small piece of land in the garden to build a small house with the money saved for over the last 10 years.

Although new house is just crude built and unpainted but they still felt extremely happy when the whole family had their real own home. In 2013, the 6th member of the family - Tram was born. Looking pretty youngest daughter, Phuong and Ty did not expect a undercurrent was happening with their family.

When Tram was 3 months old, she did not gain weight. Sometimes, her parents found Tram felt very difficulty in breathing so they took her to the hospital for checking. Doctors said that the child had congenital heart disease and needed to be hospitalized for surgery as soon as possible. Tram’s parents panicked and only saw darkness in the future. They tried to borrow money from their relatives but their relatives did not help anything.

Since Ty knew that her daughter had heart defect, she could not sleep every night. Her husband works as a bricklayer with the income about 2 million salary / month. While Ty only stayed at home to take care of her young child. In addition, she has 3 more children who are students. Therefore, the parents are totally helpless before the large too for the surgery.

Listen to confidence of Ms. Ty, we also fell very pity for them. It is so hard for them to save their child when poverty pursues persistently them. They just wish to have good health and enough time for working to earn money for the surgery. I also believe that one day they will earn enough money for Tram’s operation fee. However, Tram’s life cannot wait any longer. She needs to be operated so that the cry will be replaced by the glistening smile for a new life.

Profile of Tram was quickly sent to the generosity and the kindness to seek support. Only a short time, Tram has received complete support from the donors. Her surgery was done timely and successful as expected. Visit her after surgery, although she still cries because the incision has not been dry yet, we still believe that since now Tram’s life will truly step over a new page just with the smiles.

Through the visit in February and March, AFEPS Association has agreed to fund three new hearing aids for the poor children with hearing impaired. Besides, each child will be supported to get speech therapy within 3 months after wearing the hearing aid. This is a great encouragement for the activities of OG CDC in the new fields about audiology and speech therapy. This activity will enhance listening skills and language development for children with hearing loss, especially poor children in the rural areas of

Thua Thien Hue Province where the conditions to take care of the ear, hearing and speech therapy is still limited.

Good news for children with hearing loss is the Lotus audiology and speech therapy Center headed by OG CDC is opened. This is an opportunity to poor children with hearing impaired to be cared better.

We especially thank AFEPS Association for giving us first help to conduct this activity. We also hope to get more help from donors for children with hearing loss so that they can hear the sounds of life.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR POOR STUDENTS AFTER HEART OPERATION, GOOD STUDENTS WITH HARD CONDITION



With the support of the donors, in the first quarter 2014, OG CDC- Hue university of Medicine and Pharmacy have granted 150 scholarships for poor students after heart operation in Thua Thien Hue province and Quang Tri province. The total number of 323,385,000 vnd was given in this time, including the amount of money for students after heart operation is 162,255,000 vnd and the amount of money for students with hard condition is 161,130,000 vnd. This is an annual activity of OG CDC

in order to encourage children to overcome difficulties, continue going to school and become a helpful person of society.

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

THE ACTIVITIES AT FUTURE SCHOOL



In order to support for severe children with disabilities, the Future School has developed the basic activities to support for our children in sensory integration, social skills, language and communication such as: sharing skill, eye contact, turn taking... and self help skills. With the good guidance from teachers, our children can involve actively in some activities of the session. Hopefully with teachers' effort, children gradually can do some daily activities independently.

The vocational training is highly focused in our school for adolescents with disabilities during the last time. Every afternoon, our children will join in incense making and sewing class. 3 children in Duc Son class also join in this class as the sewing class is not started yet. All children are very happy in participating these activities. In the last quarter, we have guided for our children how to make greeting cards from paper. This technique requires good fine motor and skill from children. They are very motivated and fully concentrate on rolling small pieces of paper to decorate for the cards.

BRETAGNE-VIETNAM ASSOCIATION'S CONTRIBUTION ON THE PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES.

With the greatly support of Bretagne Vietnam Association, during the last years, OGCDC have implemented the following programs for children with disabilities, including:

- The Parrainage program for 45 poor children with disabilities in Future School, Duc Son Care Orphanage Centre, Early Intervention class. This is a very useful program for underprivileged children to offer them more chance to go to school. Also, their small gifts have been considerable encouragements for the children and families as well.
- Supporting the sewing machine for the purpose of orientation of career and vocational training for the students. Even the children can not make the products now but they are very happy that they can sew for their own clothes.
- Building the Charity Hostel for poor patients during the period of waiting for hospitalization or periodic medical examination and also for patients who live far away and need long treatment such as rehabilitation, orthopedics, etc. From end of 2010 to now, the Hostel has given the residence for 496 patients and family members. In the fact of decreasing needs of patients, with the permission of Bretagne, OGCDC plan to shift a patient room for special class for children with autism.
- Supporting a Early Intervention class for 9 children with disabilities.
- Supporting a special class in Huong Hoa commune, Nam Dong district..

It can be said that the selfless devotion of Bretagne-Vietnam Association has had a part in bringing substantial benefits for disabled children and poor families to help them overcome current difficulties and independently better themselves in life.

SPECIAL CLASSES IN NAM DONG



The activities of 2 special classes are running well with regularly supervision of OGCDC. In order to enhance lunch quality for children as well as creating a stable job for our teachers, we are very happy to get the donation from Eyes Of Compassion Relief Organization (Canada). EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAM

SETTING UP CURRICULUM FOR EARLY INTERVENTION CLASS



Early intervention class for under-six children with developmental delay is still rather new area in Vietnam generally and in the Central particularly. Setting up curriculum for early intervention class is one of our main targets to improve quality of early intervention class. For setting it up which fits with practical use as well as children's special needs, we have been implementing with participation of related teachers through workshops. With further availability of curriculum, the teacher can have better orientation in setting up goals as well as activities; also this is one of basic measurement of the class's efficiency.

OUT-SERVICE EARLY INTERVENTION MODEL



Meeting the increasing needs of under-six children with developmental delay, we have been extending out-service program for conducting early intervention for the children. With this model, the children and their parents can be accessed to intervention method and the children themselves can have opportunities to participate in normal kindergartens.

INCREASING NEEDS FOR ATTENDING EARLY INTERVENTION CLASS



The needs of early intervention as class form for children with developmental delay are increasing more and more. Recently many children have been assessed in which some of their parents have been consulted to attend at the class. For meeting the arising demand, we have been planning to open one more special class for elder children who have been trained on basic skills.

PHYSICAL THERAPY AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM

ONGOING SUPPORT VISITS BY MRS SUE DURAND AND MRS DENISE PALMER.



In January of 2014, OGCDC welcomed the return of Sue and Denise from Australia, to continue their training and support of Physiotherapy programs of OGCDC and Rehabilitation departments of Hue Medicine and Pharmacy University Hospital.

During this visit they worked with our staff to supported children with mobility disability by providing items such as supportive boots and equipment to enable the children to engage in activities of daily living. They also went with our staff to Centres supported by OGCDC, as well as to the Nam Dong district to offer technical support for teachers and the parents under the community rehabilitation program.

Sue also conducted a “train the trainer” course to provide an opportunity for the therapists and lecturers to enhance their skills in delivery of the practical component of the physiotherapy university degree course and also to run their own small group continuing education sessions. This will be supported in the long term by a website forum for therapists overseen by OGCDC.

With the financial support from the Dreamin Foundation Inc Adelaide, South Australia, Sue and Denise were able to engage the services of Dr Rebecca Dogan, PhD, BCBA-D, LMHP, Paediatric Psychologist & Behavioural Consultant. Dr Dogan conducted a 2 day theory and practical training course on evidence based assessment and treatment of neurodevelopmental disorders, specifically Autism Spectrum Disorder. There were 22 participants on the course, which included therapists, teachers, technicians and doctors of Rehabilitation departments of Hue Medicine and Pharmacy University hospitals. The training provided relevant and useful knowledge for all the attendees.

In conclusion, we would like to express sincere thanks to Dreamin Foundation Inc, for their continued support of our early childhood physiotherapy intervention program which is achieving good results for the children with special needs.

THE ACTIVITIES OF PHYSICAL THERAPY GROUP



As a result of the extensive training over the years by Sue and her team of consultant physiotherapists, our therapists are able to continue the physical therapy program through delivery of the individualised treatment plans for children with disabilities in Huong Thuy district, Huong Tra district and Thua Thien Hue Province. Reviews of progress of the

children are made and equipment and treatment plans adjusted accordingly. Parents and teachers are taught how to use the equipment to benefit the child and photographic plans are generated and left with families and teachers to assist them to follow the interventions. In addition, the physical therapy programs continue in the Centres overseen by OGCDC as well as training of teachers who work directly with the children.



The Special Education and Early Intervention Program for children with intellectual disabilities receives great care and support from kind organizations and individuals.
