Sharings

The healed heart

Arriving to the area of Mai market of Thuy Duong Ward, Huong Thuy Commune, Hue City, it took us time to find out the house of Mrs. Trinh Thi Be – a vegetable seller in the market. Greeting us was a little woman with very sad eyes. She is the mother of Le Dien Nguyen Bao – a three years old boy who needed a surgery because of his heart defect.



Following Mrs. Be to her house which was the place she is living with her family. In here, we had chance to listen to the story of her life. She got married when she was 22 years old. Her husband – Mr. Toan was a bricklayer and a hired labor. His family had many children, one older brother also married. Therefore, his parents decided a half of the house for the family of Mr. Toan and his older brother. The rest half is for Toan's parents and another brother who had mental illness.

More than 1 year after the marriage, Be delivered a daughter. After that, Be continued her old carrier – a vegetable seller. Despite the unstable income, Be and Toan could manage to cover their daily need. Life is still hard but they were undaunted. They believed that with the health and hard working, someday, their life would be better. However, their desire did not come true – Mr.

Toan's spinal column was pain. Although the disease was not too serious, he could not do the heavy work. That also means that he could not continue his old job to earn money to feed his wife and children. Since then, Be must go to the market sooner and come back later. She had to work harder and harder to earn money to replace her husband.

Their life always faced to financial difficulties. Besides Toan's parents were old so they are unable to work. However, they had to raise a child with mental illness. That means that they cannot help anything for Be's family. That is the reason why they have to wait 6 years after the first child to have the second one. Bao was born normally and very cute. However, since he was 1.5 years old, he has loosened weight and ate very little. Too worried about him, he was taken to see the doctor. When the doctor informed that Bao got heart defect, his parents could not believe on what they hear. The doctor explained enthusiastically about his son's disease. However, they just can sit quietly. The austere and the shabby shows clearly on the faces of Be and Toan. They tried to calculate how to earn money for the surgery of their child. However, they also do not sell the house and the income from selling the vegetables is so low. If Toan accepts to get risk to go to work, the money is just sufficient for the meal and milk for the child and the mother to stay in the hospital. Further more. The daughter is 2nd grade pupil, she also need money for eating and tuition. With such burden, Be and Toan fall into financial difficult which cannot escape.

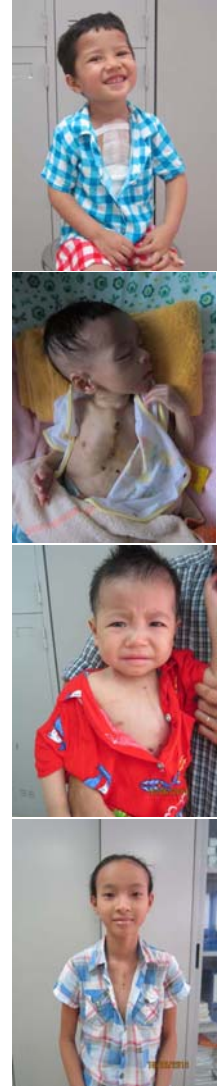
Bao heart defect becomes serious day by day. Doctors repeatedly urged the family to take Bao to the hospital for the surgery that makes his parents feel inescapable. Fortunately, Bao's family was instructed to OGCDC. Not long after, with the support of donors, Bao was supported 100% the costs to be timely surgery.



On 18/04/2014, Bao was discharged healthy with happy smile on his lips. Over here, we would like to express our most sincere thanks to the donors accompanied to OGCDC to support poor children with heart disease over years.

The profits are to pay salaries and insurance for the shop staffs, the shop operation costs, and fund the three following program:

- Heart surgeries for adult patients in Hue Central Hospital
- Surgeries for poor children with cleft lip and palate.
- Community-based dental healthcare program for poor persons with disabilities.

HOA SEN (LOTUS) CENTRE FOR AUDIOLOGY AND SPEECH THERAPY



On May 14th 2014, the Hoa Sen (Lotus) Centre - a new Centre of OG CDC for Audiology and Speech therapy has been inaugurated. Hoa Sen centre is for assessing hearing competence of the children and adults, counseling for the suitable hearing aids and training speech therapy for children with speech delays or disorders.

With the support of our donors, the Lotus centre will donate used hearing aids for needed poor patients with hearing impairment with the hope that they can improve their hearing and communication capability and have a better life.

PHYSICAL THERAPY AND REHABILITATION PROGRAM

On 28 and 29 April, 2014, the physical therapy team cooperated with early intervention team to screen children with disabilities as well as train for their parents in Nam Dong district. Through the training, we provided them information related to cerebral palsy, a number of appropriate method of therapies and the role of families in supporting children at home. With such knowledge, we hope the parents can understand and know how to take care of children with disabilities at home.



To better support for children with disabilities in Physical Therapy program, from May 3/2014, we have trained Ms. Nguyen Thi Hong (an early intervention teacher) on physical therapy program so that Hong can support children with disability at home. After the training period and doing home visits with physical therapy, now Hong can do home visits by herself and rely on exercise plans which have been developed for each child to handle. Also, Hong has experience in teaching children with disabilities so besides doing exercises to improve motor skills for children, Hong offer ways to enhance communication skills for children by using communication boards or guiding to parents how to support children so they become more independent in their daily lives.



Physical therapy program at the Future School, Hue and Nam Dong Early Intervention Center have started summer vacation from May 6/2014. This is also the time to our team assessed the ability of the child in the past 6 months and given a new appropriate treatment plan for each child in the upcoming school year.

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM

THE VOLUNTEER PROGRAM OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS FROM SEATTLE ACADEMY (USA)



In the cooperation between OG CDC and Seattle Academy (USA), we are very happy to welcome group of teachers and high school students from Seattle in April. During 4 voluntarily days at Future School, Duc Son special classes and Healing the Wounded Heart Shop for artisans with hearing impairments, the students have contributed many activities for our students, such as: making garden,

cleaning and decorating class, making products with hearing impairment artisans as well as teaching art work for children with intellectual disabilities. We are very happy to get the donation from Seattle of 65 used hearing aids. This is a very meaningful gifts for poor patients with hearing impairments in OG CDC's Centre of Audiology and Speech Therapy.



THE 2014 INTERCULTURAL AND INTERPROFESSIONAL STUDENT PLACEMENT PROGRAM, UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND, AUSTRALIA

From May 5th to 30th, 2012, a team of 6 students and 2 professors of University of Queensland have



worked with OG CDC to deliver a service across at the intervention and education centres for children with disabilities in Hue City and one centre in the Nam Dong mountain district of Thua Thien Hue Province. Students came to provide an interprofessional and intercultural experience as well as identifying the needs by the professions of speech pathology, occupational therapy, physiotherapy for the disabled children in the Future School, Early intervention centre in Hue and Nam Dong and Nguyệt Biều Catholic Orphanage. Basing on the specific characteristics of centre, student is very active in observation and make the plan to provided

specific education and resources to ensure sustainable and long-term outcomes. Along this program, the group of students also conducted a therapy workshop with the participation of OG CDC's early intervention and special education teachers and 2 teachers from Nguyệt Bieu Centre. This is really a very fruitfully program and we highly appreciate the greatly support of your professors and your students.



BUILDING THE MULTI-PURPOSE ASTRO TURF AREA FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES IN FUTURE SCHOOL, SUPPORTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND (AUSTRALIA)

In the school year of 2014, there are 60 students with intellectual disabilities from Future School, Duc Son Orphanage and special classes in Nam Dong mountainous district received the school fee support from Liliane Foundation (Netherland). After a school year of 2013-2014, students get many achievements especially with the student group from 15-25 aged, who mostly can do independently in the self help skills and participate actively in vocational training classes in the afternoon. Especially, the student Pham Phuong Bach from Future School, he is now working in the Hoa Sen, a thrift shop for selling used items. Some more students will be sent to this shop for practical session in the new school year. Although our students have many progresses, they still need more training and support that enable them to develop their skills and to be independent in the future. Student's progress is a big encouragement for parents, teachers as well as generous sponsors.

At the beginning of June 2014, we organized a year-end summation 2012-2013 at 3 class particular at Nam Dong district. After a year, they have made fast progress, especially the skill social and intelligence. We hope that with the big help of teachers, they can participate in the program of orientation professional. The two special classes in Duc Son Orphanage have ended school year in the beginning of June. In the last school year, besides the vocational training with sewing and incense making class for advance students, the life skills such as going to the market and buying food, cooking and preparing for lunch, well behavior on street and follow the traffic rules, etc... for all children and the physical therapy have been enhanced for children with physical disabilities. All classes in Nam Dong and Duc Son will start for the new school year in August 2014.



EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAM

SCREENING IN NAM DONG DISTRICT



By the end of April, with the cooperation of a psychiatric doctor from Hue university of Medicine and Pharmacy and pediatric doctor from Nam Dong health center, we conducted screening as well as general assessment for children under 8 years old in Nam Dong mountainous district for early detection and early intervention for children with special needs. After the screening, we found out a group of children with disabilities and children with developmental delay. These children will be supported with different kinds of intervention such as home-based physical therapy for children with motor disability or motor delay; early intervention class for children with intellectual disability, treatment or surgery for children with physical defects. We sincerely say thanks to the GIZ for financially supporting us implementing this meaningful activity.

TRAINING FOR LOCAL WORKERS AND PARENTS IN NAM DONG DISTRICT

After the screening in Nam Dong, we conducted training for the local workers in 11 communes of the district and parents of children with special needs participating in the program. The training aims at improving awareness of the local workers and the parents about meaning of early intervention to development of the children. In addition, we stressed some other important contents for the local workers like basic knowledge on early detection for children with cerebral palsy, autism and Down syndrome, and also practicing on counseling skills. The participants showed deep interest in the training and looked forward to further training in the future.



NAM DONG EARLY INTERVENTION CLOSING THE SCHOOL YEAR 2013-2014



With the support of The War Legacies Project (USA) and The Cheer of Vietnam organization (USA), the early intervention class in Nam Dong has been making positive turnings in caring and intervention for children with developmental delay. For ensuring and improving quality of learning and teaching, the teachers have been also frequently trained and have practical opportunities. Most of the children have achieved lots of progresses in developmental skills as well as integration skills in community. By the beginning of May after the screening, there were two more new eligible children attended at the class.

TRAINING FOR TEACHERS IN EARLY INTERVENTION AND SPECIAL EDUCATION



With the professional support of Ms. Kerstin Gruener (GIZ organization) – an advisor for early intervention program of OG CDC, we have organized training courses for the teachers and therapists in Hue city and Nam Dong district. The training not only focuses on knowledge and skills for supporting the children but also on positive reinforcement disciplines. In addition, some workshops were held among the interdisciplinary team including program experts, supervisors, therapists and teachers in the program for collecting

ideas and base for completing curriculum for early intervention class.

TRAINING FOR PARENTS IN HUE CITY



By the middle of May, we conducted training for parents of early intervention program with contents in the method of picture exchange communication skill and positive reinforcement disciplines. Especially, the later provided the parents with opportunities for reminding their childhood so that they can understand their child' emotion and feeling through which they can improve their skills in bringing the child appropriately to to their psychological development. Although the number of participants is

limiting but the attendants have shown their enthusiastic attitude and interests in the training which is very close to their daily life and to their needs

By the end of June, 2014, the working contract between the GIZ organization and the OG CDC has come to the end closing the long 13 years of companying together for the mission of changing lives of underprivileged children and their families. Also by the time, we have to say good bye to Ms. Kerstin Gruener, GIZ's expert who has been working as an advisor for early intervention program of OG CDC during the last 3 years. Ms. Kerstin has made invaluable contribution in training human resource as well as helping create

material resources like booklets, reference books and curriculum in early intervention for improving sustainable development of the program.

The fields of Special education and Early intervention are rather new in Vietnam but we have been so lucky that the former DED as well as the GIZ at present supported us with 4 successive experts within the 13-year period from 2001 till 2014. For meeting the needs of society development and skill development as well, we are turning into new strategies which aim at vocational training for handicap adolescents. We do hope that the GIZ and OG CDC could be in close cooperation in the future to open the door for job opportunities for the handicapped people. Once again, we would like to say thank you so much for all of the whole-hearted support of the DED and GIZ for the sakes of the children with disabilities as well as for the sustainable development of the special education and early intervention programs in the future.
